Career advice at West Midlands Foundation School

A Career advisor helps trainee make realistic choices about their training and work by providing the right advice, information and guidance. The career advisor role involves assisting trainees in making decisions about their future and reaching their full potential. The advice should be honest, impartial non-judgemental advice. They help trainees to focus on needs and interests and give feedback. They also help to



discover trainee's aims, aspirations, values, interests, skills and qualities. The other important component of this role is to do Mentoring, supporting and inspiring the next generation of doctors.

It was interesting to find by looking into how career advice is provided in other regions that career advice often sit with PSU for many foundation school and most advisors from psychology background. They often do it as their full-time role. Our roles were new so there was no script, expectations and guidance so it was all about setting high standards of delivery of career advice for which we had to keep ourselves up to date with new information and 'best practices' in relation to career.

We at West midland Foundation school aim to deliver evidence-based career advice that involves 1:1 meetings to discuss career options to listen to their ideas and career aims and helping to Identify skill gaps and how to deal with them. We also help to consider a range of options of career that are available. During this session Advice on tasters, training courses wellbeing resources PSU etc., is regularly provided. We also have been running small group workshops and presentations, that have received very good feedback.

Some of the topics that were covered in 1:1 discussion was career change, Career break/gap year, mental health/ anxiety and Alternative careers. It was also observed that female trainees approached us more than male trainees that could be related to many issues, something that need to be explored in fullness of time, as it is still in early days in this new role due to pandemic affect.

Currently we are looking into exploring other ways to facilitate such as psychometric testing. Career planners? As there is some evidence of them being useful, and help to develop career related online platforms, podcast etc. We are aiming to support ES/FTPD role further in relation to Career as a first step and to identify trainees early in their career needing support. We aim to proactively organise career workshop and encourage trainees to attend career courses offer by the foundation school. We continue to support trainees with their mental health and Well-being. Finally, we regularly remind trainees the 'Importance of Chance' in their careers and Promoting Curiosity, Persistence, Flexibility, Optimism, appropriate risk-taking behaviour in relation to their careers.


