This is a free scheme that supports the wellbeing of F1 doctors. Sessions are held virtually for 1 hour via Zoom.

Professionals Together is an award-winning scheme designed to support FY1 doctors across the West Midlands in making the transition from student to practitioner. It combines

The scheme always evaluates well (see attached) and we look forward to sharing the experience of processing life in medicine with a new cohort of doctors this year.
