Request for shortlisters Paediatric National Recruitment 2023

We require **Paediatric Consultants** to help with the shortlisting process of these recruitment rounds. As a shortlister you will be required to review applications and score using a scoring matrix (full guidance will be provided)

Shortlisting will take place during the following timeframes:

ST1 National Paediatric Training - Tuesday 20th December 2022 - Friday 13th January 2023

ST3 & ST4 National Paediatric Training - Tuesday 17th January 2023 - Wednesday 15th February 2023

During the shortlisting window you will be allocated a set number of applications to shortlist. You do not need to be available for the whole shortlisting window but you will need to ensure all applications allocated to you have been shortlisted by the window close date. This is important to ensure we can keep to the Recruitment timeline.

Janet Anderson Prize 2022

You are invited to put forward nominations for this year's Janet Anderson prize. This prize has been instituted by Dr Janet Anderson on her retirement as Consultant Paediatrician. She was deeply involved in the training of paediatricians and this award bears recognition of the trainee's role.

Trainees are an integral part of our teams and many bring such great value. This is a fantastic opportunity for us to show both recognition for their contribution and appreciation for the role they play within our teams.

Prize:

This is a competitive prize to be awarded annually to a specialty trainee.

A further award will be available for Foundation year trainees. Nominations and selection criteria are the same.

A panel of paediatricians will consider the nominations and select the trainee that has demonstrated the most outstanding contribution to child health in the West Midlands.

The awards will be presented at the virtual West Midlands Paediatric Society Meeting on Friday 5th November 2021.

Nominees:

Specialty trainee ST1-8 or FY1/2

Nominations are for individual trainees.

A joint nomination will be considered if more than one trainee has worked together and the contribution is as a result of this combined partnership.

Nominations from:

- 1. Consultants and Non-training Grade Doctors
- 2. Trainees (must be seconded by a consultant)
- 3. **NO** self-nominations
- 4. Each nomination needs to be seconded by another Paediatrician: Consultant, Non-training Grade, Trainee or a Paediatric Nurse.

Selection criteria:

- 1. We are looking to award the prize to a trainee who has contributed most in any area that may include patient care, training and education, peer support and pastoral care, representation of colleagues, service development, and clinical governance.
- 2. Research activity will be considered if this was translated into activity that directly contributed into the above areas for the trainee's team or unit. There are separate prizes for academic contribution to paediatrics so focussing the nomination on the trainee's research activities will not be to their advantage.

A Nugget About Supported Return To Training (SuppoRTT) from Anna Darbyshire – HEE SuppoRTT Clinical Fellow

- **-What is Supported.** Supported Return to Training (Supported) is a centrally funded, locally run, Health Education England (HEE) programme which aims to support **ALL** postgraduate doctors to **SAFELY** and **CONFIDENTLY** return to training after a sustained period of absence.
- **-Who is SuppoRTT for?** SuppoRTT is available for all postgraduate doctors who have had a period of usually >3 months absence from training regardless of the reason. This may include parental leave, carers leave, research, career break, illness.
- **-What is the process?** Process is led by the postgraduate doctor and facilitated by ES. It includes pre-absence planning, pre-return planning and a return to training review. A bespoke package of support is devised depending on your personal needs.
- **-How do I find out more?** Talk to your ES / TPD / Trust SuppoRTT Champion, or email SuppoRTT.wm@hee.nhs.uk

Join the Health Education England Genomics Education Programme evaluation team

Are you a clinician keen to know more about how to order a genomic test for your patients? And would you be willing to share your learning experience? This autumn, the Genomics Education Programme (GEP) will be launching an exciting new online course to help clinicians understand the genomic testing process for rare disease indications. The GEP are looking for clinicians who are unfamiliar with the testing process to be among the very first to complete the course and provide us with feedback. Your input will inform how we shape the course content for future learners.

This new course presents a comprehensive introduction to genomic testing for rare disease and covers both the practical aspects and the wider contexts. It is designed to be taken over two weeks, with around 3-4 hours of learning each week. Those who sign up to be course evaluators will be given a set of follow-up evaluation questions, and a payment of £100 will be offered to individuals who complete and submit their full evaluation.
