Paediatric Return to work Sim (PRTW)

This is a one-day simulation course designed for paediatric trainees who have been out-ofprogramme for any reason or recently returned to training from a long period of absence and would like to re-orientate themselves into clinical practice. We know that coming back into clinical practice can pose new challenges therefore we aim to provide an immersive and supportive learning environment to enable candidates to refresh their existing knowledge by practicing scenarios and sharing useful tips and important changes in practice.

Acute Behavioural Crisis in CAMHS (ABC in CAMHS)

Neonatal Simulation

Neonatal Skills day

The course is designed to offer trainees practical training on common neonatal procedures including intubation, vascular access and chest drain insertion. It is included in the ST1 training programme however if you previously missed a course or would like more teaching on neonatal procedures, you may be able to join the next face-to-face course. **Next date:** 14th September 2022

SHINE (Simulation to Help in Neonatal Emergencies)

Are you just about to rotate on to your first registrar post in neonates? Does it feel like you have not done neonates for ages and need a refresher? Are you close to CCT and might be working as a consultant in a hospital with a neonatal unit? Do you feel like you just need more neonatal experience? If yes, this is the course for you!
