

Improving Global Health (IGH) Fellowship August 2022 for 6 months

About the Programme

The IGH Programme recruits NHS employees from across England, from both clinical and non-clinical backgrounds. If you are a doctor or dentist, you need to have completed your Foundation Programme training. If you have another clinical or managerial background, you need to have worked in an NHS AfC Band 6 role. The IGH Programme currently works with overseas partners in Anguilla, Cambodia, Lesotho, Myanmar, South Africa, Uganda and Zambia. NHS Fellows typically work on a local system-strengthening project, and do not provide patient care.



Programme Objectives

- Skills, competencies, and leadership development through a global fellowship
- Working in a healthcare system that is different in resource and structure to the NHS
- Improved cultural competence through working in partnership with peers overseas
- Improved resilience, professional satisfaction, and a personal growth, that add value to your team and your patients on return to the NHS

Models of Fellowships

Various models of fellowship are possible: full-time overseas placements, part-time virtual, and a hybrid model (both virtual and overseas). All models are subject to availability.

Recruitment

Recruitment for IGH Fellowships will open on 1 December 2021 and will close on 10 January 2022. Applicants must complete the application form on the website and send a CV to globallearning@hee.nhs.uk. Shortlisted candidates will be invited to a virtual 30-minute interview between 26-31 January 2022.
