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## Introduction

This booklet has been produced by the West Midlands Obstetrics and Gynaecology Trainees committee with the aim of providing some basic information about the different hospitals within the West Midlands. The booklet may be useful when selecting future hospital placements. All information included is correct to the best of our knowledge at the time of publication and is subject to change by Aug 22. Many thanks to the college tutors who helped to update this guide. Specific enquiries should be directed to the college tutor of the unit.

Every year we fill in numerous surveys about our training, education and the units we work in. All of the data from these are publicly available and very easy to access and make for very interesting reading. It's all quite self-explanatory and relatively easy to navigate and with some filtering of results you can see really well how units measure up in many different domains e.g., induction, facilities, workplace behaviours, handover etc, against each other and against the national average.

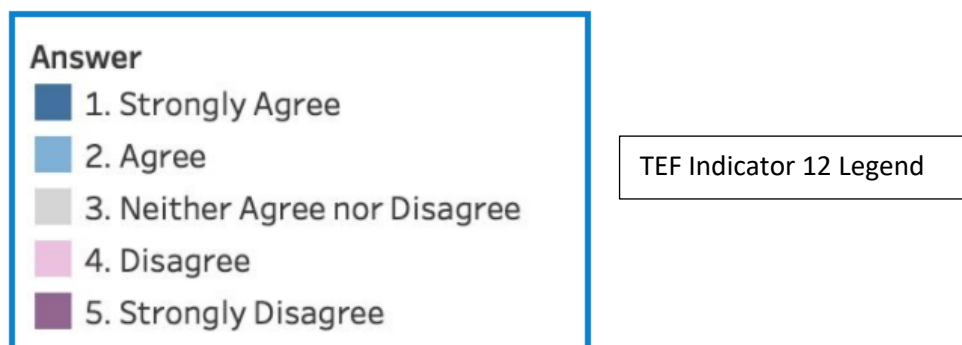


We would urge you all to read the rotations policy and placements forms 1 and 2 carefully which have been updated last year taking into account the results of last year's Hub survey. Whilst the rotations committee take a lot of time to allocate trainees to hospitals it is not possible for them to accommodate everyone's first choice (or even third choice at times). Unfortunately, if all the hospitals you have selected are full prior to allocating your post you will be placed where gaps remain at your level. Please be realistic in your choices and put 3 different hospitals down to stand the highest chance of getting a rotation of your choice. Please be assured that the rotations policy is strictly adhered to.

Trainees should NOT approach individual College tutors asking to be placed at their units or ask College tutors to ensure they are placed at their units by emailing the rotations committee. Attempts to bypass the rotations policy in this fashion by trainees will be viewed negatively by the rotations committee.
