Typical working pattern in this placement	A typical day comprises a consultant-led ward round which usually lasts till 11am. Following this, the ward round tasks are completed. Mostly the day finishes at 5pm. There is always an SPR on hand to deal with any problems. One of the F1s is based on MAU and one on Short Stay at any one time, usually rotating each month.
