Fast track – This is where patients triaged as having less urgent complaints are sent; however, this commonly includes patients with "surgical" problems such as abdominal pain, lacerations and minor trauma cases (road traffic collisions in particular) as well as the more obvious minor complaints like colds etc.

Resus – All the alerts go directly to Resus and there's the occasional stabbing who will walk in! There are a team of nurses, you and the middle grade doctor as well as a consultant in hours.

Get stuck in – you will see the bog standard and the frankly bizarre, but all provide valuable experience in the emergency management of patients.
