Main duties of the placement	Majors – This is where the more unwell patients and those who require more urgent attention go. Your job is to assess them, decide on a management plan and refer them to the relevant speciality. The majority of patients in Majors will be admitted. Verbal referrals are required to all specialities.



	 Fast track – This is where patients triaged as having less urgent complaints are sent, however, this commonly includes patients with "surgical" problems such as abdominal pain, lacerations and minor trauma cases (road traffic collisions in particular) as well as the more obvious primary care complaints like colds etc. Resus – All the alerts go directly to Resus and there's the occasional stabbing who will walk in! There are a team of nurses, you and the SpR. Get stuck in – you will see the bog standard and the frankly bizarre, but all provide valuable experience in the emergency management of patients.
Typical working pattern in this placement	Ward rounds/CPAs are only when doing the Inpatient at Parkview clinic
Employer information	The Trust is one of the largest teaching Trusts in the United Kingdom with a reputation for excellent, friendly staff who provide high quality care from City Hospital in Birmingham and Sandwell General in West Bromwich.
