The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	 Cannulation, blood sampling, lumbar puncture, Observing more complicated procedures e.g. tracheal intubation, mechanical ventilation, central lines placements, arterial lines, resuscitation. Becoming familiar with the multi-disciplinary team approach and the role of different agencies and the importance of appropriate communication between different disciplines. Involved in simple administrative tasks e.g. organizing events, participating in rota management, organizing presentations etc. FY1 will have the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the dynamics of the Short Stay Paediatric Unit, communication with other units and transferring patients across sites (GHH & BHH). They will acquire the skill of spotting the unwell child and recognizing the abnormal physiology
