The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	The acute medical unit is a combined assessment unit and short stay unit with fifty bed/trolley spaces. Foundation year doctors are expected to attend/perform daily ward rounds on the unit. They will get the opportunity to see patients and develop management plans but with daily consultant rounds and registrar support there are excellent opportunities for learning and regular feedback. Doctors are exposed to a broad range of medical conditions, learn to stabilise sick patients and usually achieve competence in a wide range of medical procedures during their rotation.
