Main duties of the placement	Ensure hand over lists are regularly updated. Attend morning and evening handover daily. Present on daily ward round ensuring notes are up to date and changes to management or need for investigations are implemented. Chasing up investigation results.
Typical working pattern in this placement	Daily ward round every morning. Ward based jobs take much of the afternoon. Attend weekly departmental meetings. On-call duties. Limited opportunity to attend clinic due to busy nature of job. Opportunity to partake in audits.
