| Main duties of the placement              | <ul> <li>Care of predominantly gastroenterology and also general medical patients on GI Ward; e.g. ward rounds; ensuring up to date handover sheet; requesting bloods, investigations, imaging and ensuring complete; discharge paperwork and ensuring follow up; clerking new admissions</li> <li>Management of acutely unwell patients on ward</li> <li>General medical on call - includes clerking Clinical Decision Unit / day ward cover during weekends / ward cover at night</li> <li>Prepare &amp; present at weekly MDT inflammatory bowel disease meeting between GI &amp; colorectal team</li> <li>Attending weekly journal club hosted by colorectal / GI team</li> <li>Many opportunities for audit work &amp; presentations</li> </ul> |
