Placement	FY1 General Surgery
The department	<p>General Surgery provides emergency surgical care for a population of around 700 000. This ensures the opportunity to experience all aspects of emergency surgical care.</p> <p>The colorectal unit has a wide practice in functional, malignant and inflammatory bowel disease, providing experience in all aspects of patient care, including enhanced recovery.</p> <p>The Upper GI Unit is the Gastro-oesophageal unit for Birmingham and the Black Country covering both malignant disease and complex benign disease. In addition the sarcoma unit delivers care for intra-abdominal sarcomas to the Midlands and Central England.</p>

Supervisor(s) for the placement	Over the period of your placement, you will be working with a number of Consultants all of whom can provide clinical supervision during the time you are on duty with them. However, you will be assigned a specific named Clinical supervisor for the placement and a named Educational Supervisor for the year.

Main duties of the placement	<p>The work on the Surgical unit will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ward duties include supporting the care and recovery of patients after a range of intermediate and major surgery. This includes maintaining contemporaneous notes, arranging appropriate investigations in consultation with other members of the team, collating results and summarizing latest developments with patients on ward. • Preparing the theatre lists for the teams in conjunction with the consultants <p>On call duties include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assessing new patients referred to surgery in conjunction with more senior members of the team, • caring for day-to-day needs of emergency surgical patients on emergency surgery unit • General care of the patients on the ward after theatre – with skills to be gained in complex fluid management and assessment of cardio-respiratory problems • Preparing for the weekly meeting when patients being admitted the following week are discussed to ensure all assessments are complete
