The department	The Stroke Unit has 36 beds on a shared Stroke/ geriatric/medicine ward lead by three Stroke Medicine/Geriatric Medicine Consultant's and two Stroke Neurologists.
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	 Provision of medical care to older inpatients under consultant supervision; assessment & admission of medical patients as part of Clinical Decision Unit on- call team. Where the placement is based	University Hospital Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust
Supervisor(s) for the placement	Over the period of your placement, you will be working with a number of Consultants all of whom can provide clinical supervision during the time you are on duty with them. However, you will be assigned a specific named Clinical supervisor for the placement and a named Educational Supervisor for the year.
Main duties of the placement	 Ward based management of 12 stroke/geriatric patients. Acute and chronic patients. Also cover any general medical patients on the ward. Work closely with physiotherapists, SALT and OT regarding rehabilitation and discharge targets. Discharge plans as appropriate including to rehabilitation hospitals such as Moseley Hall hospital. Clerking of new stroke patients once they arrive on wards or in ED under the supervision of the stroke consultant of the day. Should all be seen by a consultant and stroke co-ordinator prior to arrival on ward Daily ward round, also daily review of new patients by Acute Stroke Consultants. Ensuring relevant investigations done for new stroke patients. Also on general medical on-call rota
