Placement	FY1 Urology
The department	The department of Urology provides a comprehensive secondary care core urological service for the local community.
	We are also a tertiary referral centre for complex bladder, prostate, renal and testicular cancer.
	We provide a tertiary care service for complex stones, functional urological conditions and neuron-urology.
	The department also provides specialist urological trauma services with pioneering work in this area.
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	The post-holder will provide support for the urology ward helping to prepare patients for surgery and managing them post operatively. They will also help in the management of the emergency urological caseload.
	The post is supported by a nurse led preadmissions service that frees the foundation doctors to attend theatre, outpatient clinics and specialist diagnostic and therapeutic clinics.
	There is a strong research theme in the department giving post-holder many opportunities to explore academic medicine if they wish.

Supervisor(s) for the placement	Over the period of your placement, you will be working with a number of Consultants all of whom can provide clinical supervision during the time you are on duty with them. However, you will be assigned a specific named Clinical supervisor for the placement and a named Educational Supervisor for the year.

Main duties of the placement	The main duties of the placement is to support the more senior doctors in the department on the ward rounds and ensure the patient management plans are attended to. Once these duties are complete the post holder will be encouraged to take advantage of the wealth of clinical experiences available to them within the department.
Typical working pattern in this placement	There are daily business ward rounds every morning and a review round in the evening. There are theatre sessions running all day Monday to Friday. There is regular outpatient diagnostic and therapeutic clinics running every day and the post-holder will be encouraged to attend.
