Daily ward rounds with registrar and consultants to review Non-emergency elective admissions and post-op patients. Helping out in emergency/elective theatres. Learn to diagnose emergency surgical cases and their management. Management of acutely unwell patients. Performing minor ward based procedures and gaining experience. When in theatre they learn suturing techniques, local anesthetic infiltration and holding the Laproscope for the operating surgeon.
