Individual Placement Description – Burton Hospital

Placement	FY1 Paediatrics
The department	Paediatrics
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	The FY1 in Paediatrics works 0900 to 1700 and is involved across the unit with all patient care which includes - acute admissions, ward based work, neonatal unit, attending deliveries and newborn examinations. FY1 have the opportunity to attend outpatient clinics.
	Induction is provided at the start of placement. Session includes paediatric prescribing. Training in Paediatric Immediate Life Support and Newborn life Support ideally within 1 <sup>st</sup> month or prior to placement where possible. Daily consultant ward round with opportunity to present a history, observe an
	examination by the consultant and to learn from discussions around case. Guidelines available for the management of common paediatric problems on the peadiatric intranet webpage. FY1 are encouraged to attend along with team, Paediatric resuscitations in the Emergency Department.
	Trainees experience multi-disciplinary team working including safe guarding as the team works closely with the nursing staff, physiotherapists, dieticians, specialist nurses, community nurses and social services.
	FY1s are encouraged to present and discuss cases at the grand rounds. They are also allocated a topic and case to present for peer led teaching. There is a plenty of opportunity to undertake a supervised audit or service improvement project.
	Encouraged to undertake Paediatric procedures include - IV cannulation, blood taking and lumbar puncture.
	F1s are expected to attend the structured departmental teaching and also the Generic Foundation Teaching programme.

Main duties of the placement	Attend and participate in handovers and ward rounds including neonatal unit – undertake the jobs generated from the ward round. Take histories and examine patients on PAU or admitted to the wards via outpatient clinic. Participate in emergency management as part of paediatric resuscitation team. Attend deliveries and perform Newborn examinations. Completion of discharge summaries and TTOs in a timely manner. Perform cannulations and venepuctures. Participate in teaching and audit. Expected to attend Departmental and Generic FY teaching. Maintain professional standards as per Trust policy and GMC guidance

pattern in this placement	Rotate weekly between Paediatric Ward and Neonatal/Postnatal Ward
