The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>All F1 Doctors in hospital posts will generally be ward based during the normal working day and would be expected to deliver the daily medical care for all their Consultants patients.</p> <p>On-call commitments include assessments of patients in the Emergency Department and on the wards including vascular surgery and urology.</p> <p>The overall educational objectives of the F1 year are to provide the trainee with the knowledge, skills and attitudes to be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • take a history and examine a patient • identify and synthesize problems • learn about the management of general surgical conditions, both elective and emergency • learn a variety of practical procedures • prescribe safely • keep an accurate and relevant medical record • manage time and clinical priorities effectively • communicate effectively with patients, relatives and colleagues • use evidence, guidelines and audit to benefit patient care • act in a professional manner at all times • cope with ethical and legal issues which occur during the management of patients with general surgical problems

Main duties of the placement	<p>The FY1 doctor is responsible with other staff for the ward care of patients and the maintenance of the patient's medical record.</p> <p>The post is based in Urology, but the rota also includes general surgical duties.</p> <p>Trainees are expected to attend theatre. They are expected to attend the structured teaching programme provided by the Department and the hospital Foundation teaching programme.</p> <p>The F1 doctor will be responsible for such other specific clinical duties as allocated by Consultants, including performing other duties in occasional emergencies and unforeseen circumstances.</p>
