Placement	FY1 Anaesthetics
The department	Anaesthetics and Critical Care
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	In the first week, a four month timetable with educational aims should be agreed. The educational and other aims of the FY1 will attempt to be addressed e.g. familiarisation with the care of the acutely ill patient, career choosing, audit and clinical governance and the other generic skills of a doctor. Trainees will also have formal appraisal addressing achievements and progress. There is extensive teaching especially in the theatre setting. There will be supervision at whatever level is deemed necessary for each individual trainee. Trainees are directly supervised. FY1 teaching takes place cross-site every week from 2.30pm to 5pm (bleep-free unless on-call).
Where the	FY1s are also required to attend Simulation Training during their FY1 year.
placement is based	The Princess Royal Hospital
Supervisor(s) for the placement	Dr Stewart
Main duties of the placement	This post is supernumerary. The four months allow the post holder to become familiar with the treatment of the acutely ill patient using attachment to the Resuscitation service and possibly the High Dependency team and using Anaesthesia and Palliative Care patients as surrogates. Pre- and Postoperative care, the rudiments of Anaesthesia, care of the Airway and ventilation, pain relief and fluid management should be mastered.
	The Intensive Care unit is recognised as excellent and has Higher Training status. Time may possibly be spent in the unit depending upon the trainee's progress.
Typical working pattern in this	This post is supernumerary with no on-calls.
placement	Trainees spend 5-6 weeks in Anaesthesia 5-6 weeks in Intensive Care 5 -6 weeks in the Severn Hospice.
