Individual Placement Description – Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital NHS Trust

Placement	FY1 Obstetrics and Gynaecology
The department	Obstetrics and Gynaecology
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	There is an opportunity to attend operating theatre sessions (day cases and inpatient surgery), labour ward and out-patient clinics (gynaecological and antenatal) during which the FY1 can expect to widen his or her experience of the management of obstetric and gynaecological cases.
	Training days are provided on acute obstetric emergencies and neonatal resus. Generic FY1 teaching takes place cross-site every week from 2.30pm to 5pm and is strictly 'bleep-free' time.
	There is departmental teaching once a week and many opportunities to present at teaching, audit meetings, mortality & morbidity meetings and clinical governance meetings.
	Medical emergency simulation training in the FY1 year is compulsory.
	This post offers great training opportunities in women's health to motivated enthusiastic doctors in training.

Supervisor(s) for the placement	Dr J Pannikar or Mr R Foon
Main duties of the placement	The FY1 based on the gynaecology ward is supervised by a Resident ST or Registrar at all times.
	The duties include:
	 Ward rounds The care of acute and elective admissions Writing of ward notes and discharge letters to General Practitioners and general administration.
	Theatre work is predominantly assisting rather than observing, with many opportunities to learn.
	The FY1s are responsible for running the departmental website and are also expected to help assess patients for suitability for theatre.
Typical working pattern in this	This Mon-Fri un-banded job allows all weekends and nights to be free whilst still gaining exposure to a vast variety of settings.

placement	For FY1-A Ward work is 4 days a week 0730-1800, whilst FY1-B does Tues - Thurs 0830 - 1700 attending theatres and clinics and then covers the ward on a Friday. Week's alternate and annual leave is expected to be taken.
Employer information	Please note that due to Trust reconfiguration our posts may change hospital site/specialty/on-call frequency during 2017/2018. Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital NHS Trust was formed in 2003 and is the main provider of acute medical care for half a million people in Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin and Mid Wales. Most services are provided at the Princess Royal Hospital in Telford and the Royal Shrewsbury Hospital in Shrewsbury.
