Individual Placement Description – Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital NHS Trust

<b>Placement</b>	FY1 General Surgery (Upper GI)
<b>The department</b>	Scheduled Care
<b>The type of work to expect and learning opportunities</b>	<p>Attendance at ward rounds and operating theatre sessions will be required, during which the FY1 can expect to widen his or her experience of the management of surgical cases.</p> <p>Attendance in outpatient clinics maybe required at the discretion of the Consultants. Initial assessment and management of emergency patients during on-call periods. Assisting in the management of inpatients.</p> <p>There are minor operations sessions in the Day Surgery Unit every week and the FY1 may be asked to assist.</p> <p>Trainees will be expected to attend any local teaching sessions and Clinical Governance meetings.</p> <p>FY1 teaching takes place cross-site every week from 2.30pm to 5pm (bleep-free unless on call).</p> <p>FY1s are also required to attend Simulation Training during their FY1 year.</p>
<b>Where the placement is based</b>	Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital NHS Trust
<b>Supervisor(s) for the placement</b>	Mr Rink / Mr Riera
<b>Main duties of the placement</b>	<p>Duties primarily involve the care of emergency patients, elective inpatients and day care patients including clerking, arranging appropriate investigations, and treatment.</p> <p>Administrative duties include computerised discharge summaries which must be done before discharge to accompany the patient home.</p> <p>Communication with GPs to inform them of patient death is an important task which should be done as soon as is practicable.</p> <p>Any other duties as delegated by the Consultant in charge according to clinical need.</p> <p>Supervision is provided by an FY2/CT1–2, Specialist Registrar and Consultant.</p>
<b>Typical working pattern in this placement</b>	The FY1s work on the on-call rota and be expected to cover on-calls including twilight and night shifts. For day shifts you will be expected to be on duty in the hospital at 8am.

<b>Employer information</b>	<p>Please note that due to Trust reconfiguration our posts may change hospital site/specialty/on-call frequency during 2017/2018.</p> <p>Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital NHS Trust was formed in 2003 and is the main provider of acute medical care for half a million people in Shropshire, Telford &amp; Wrekin and Mid Wales.</p> <p>Most services are provided at the Princess Royal Hospital in Telford and the Royal Shrewsbury Hospital in Shrewsbury.</p>
