The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Teaching takes place in the work environment on ward rounds, in outpatient clinics and in the operating theatre. Monthly Clinical Governance Meetings take place. Foundation training takes place weekly from 2.30pm - 5.00pm and Foundation Year 2 trainees are encouraged to attend a Simulation Training slot throughout the year.

Main duties of the placement	Your duties start at 8am with the ward round of the inpatients and primarily involve the care of inpatients and day care patients including clerking, instigation of appropriate investigations and treatment. Supervision of these activities will be provided by the more senior staff.
	Attendance at ward rounds and operating theatre sessions provides the oportunities for informal bedside teaching, during which you can expect to widen your experience of the management of surgical cases.
	Attendance in out-patient clinics also provides the oportunity to gain important experience in the assessment and investigation of elective vascular and surgical conditions and a better understanding of the outpatient management of vascular and general surgical conditions.
	There are minor operation sessions in the Day Surgery Unit every week and you are encouraged to attend as these provide valuable operative skills training experience.
	Administrative duties include checking and signing results and completing discharge summaries which must be done prior to patient discharge.
Typical working pattern in this	On-calls are performed as part of the general surgical junior on call rota and covers general surgery and vascular surgery, with some weekend working with FY1 and SpR support.
