<b>Placement</b>	FY1 Renal Medicine
<b>The department</b>	Unscheduled Care
<b>The type of work to expect and learning opportunities</b>	<p>Ward rounds</p> <p>Teaching session informal and formal</p> <p>FY1 teaching takes place cross-site every week from 2.30 - 5.00pm (bleep-free unless on-call).</p> <p>FY1s are also required to attend Simulation Training during their FY1 year.</p>
<b>Where the placement is based</b>	Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital NHS Trust
<b>Supervisor(s) for the placement</b>	Dr Diwaker / Eardley
<b>Main duties of the placement</b>	<p>The FY1s will help with the management of Renal patients on the wards and will also be responsible for the initial assessment of acute medical patients during on-calls.</p> <p>With the advice of the Specialist Registrar and STs, the FY1 will be concerned with the immediate management of a wide range of medical problems (acute and non-acute) and will look after patients admitted whilst on-call.</p> <p>All specialities have their own ward base.</p>
<b>Typical working pattern in this placement</b>	Full shift as part of acute medical on-call covering nights, twilights, normal days etc.
<b>Employer information</b>	<p>Please note that due to Trust reconfiguration our posts may change hospital site/specialty/on-call frequency during 2017/2018</p> <p>Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital NHS Trust was formed in 2003 and is the main provider of acute medical care for half a million people in Shropshire, Telford &amp; Wrekin and Mid Wales.</p> <p>Most services are provided at the Princess Royal Hospital in Telford and the Royal Shrewsbury Hospital in Shrewsbury.</p>
