The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	FY2 cross-site teaching takes place weekly 2.30 - 5.00pm.  In addition to this, time will be set aside in your timetable for study and you are welcome to attend the regular in-house formal teaching sessions for the OSTs who are pursuing Ophthalmology as a career.  FY2s are also encouraged to attend a Simulation Training slot organised by the PGMC.

Main duties of the placement	Duties include cover of the Acute Referral Centre with the other CT/STs and Staff Grades. You are allocated time in General and Specialist Outpatient Clinics.  You will learn the basic examination techniques in ophthalmology under close supervision, together with a sound grasp of the common ophthalmic conditions There may be opportunity for some theatre sessions and to sit in with the orthoptists during your time in our department. Some of these sessions are at the Princess Royal Hospital in Telford.
