The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Royal Shrewsbury Hospital The acute management of Trauma and Orthopaedics. Experience in the Rehabilitation of Orthopaedic patients by interaction with Physiotherapists and OT's in a Multi Disciplinary environment. Ward rounds with Orthogeriatrician Specialists.
	Regular teaching for all FY2s. Audit and other projects encouraged.
	Princess Royal Hospital There will be regular teaching on trauma patients on the daily Trauma Ward round. In addition, there is a weekly teaching programme which the FY2 Doctors are expected to attend and participate in. There are opportunities for audit and presentations. The FY2 doctors are expected to complete at least one audit and one presentation during the 4-month post. There is a weekly Thursday Departmental meeting reviewing the previous week's work attended by all orthopaedic doctors. The FY2 doctors will be supervised educationally by one of the consultants.
	FY2 cross site teaching takes place weekly 2.30 - 5.00pm and FY2s are also encouraged to attend a Sim-man Training session.

Main duties of the placement	Royal Shrewsbury Hospital Junior tier made up of FY2s, core trainees, GP trainees and, from time to time, supernumerary military trainee. Duties include ward work, admission of patients from fracture clinic, assessment and admission from ED when on call and opportunities to attend clinics and theatre. All work is trauma with no substantial elective component.
	Princess Royal Hospital There are regular Fracture Clinics, Orthopaedic



	Clinics, Pre-Assessment Clinics and Subspecialty Clinics (Arthroplasty / Spine / Back Pain / Knee / Upper Limb / Children's Orthopaedics / Osteoporosis / Foot). There are regular elective theatre lists (inpatient and Day Case) and daily Trauma Lists.
Typical working pattern in this placement	Full shift rota consisting of On Call days and night shifts. Night shifts supported by Registrar (non-resident) and consultant.Trainees in T&O at Princess Royal Hospital will be working on a combined rota with ENT and will be expected to cross cover during on-calls.
