The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<ul> <li>Good experience in the running of a busy delivery suite</li> <li>Attending ward rounds</li> <li>Assessing patients in labour, on maternity assessment unit, antenatal and postnatal wards and antenatal clinic</li> <li>Assisting in obstetric theatres in caesarean sections, instrumental deliveries, perineal tears etc</li> <li>Good surgical exposure to these procedures.</li> <li>SAU</li> <li>Gynaecology theatre</li> <li>CEPOD theatre</li> <li>Gynaecology clinics</li> <li>Audit and research experience</li> </ul> To attend the monthly teaching sessions, monthly perinatal mortality/ morbidity meetings and clinical case review meetings.

Main duties of the placement	<ul> <li>Assessment of patients on SAU, Maternity Assessment Unit (MAU) and antenatal/postnatal wards with opportunity to instigate initial management plans</li> <li>Assisting with obstetrics and gynaecology theatre cases to develop surgical skills.</li> <li>Reviewing patients in gynaecology outpatient and antenatal clinics offering the opportunity to develop consultation, examination and management skills with supervision from seniors present.</li> </ul>
Typical working pattern in this placement	FY1 - Normal working day 8am-5pm. Long day 8am-10pm . Nights 8.30pm-9am. Long Day Gynae – 8am-7pm Daytime duties may differ from morning to afternoon Participate in a 1:10 on-call rota
