Main duties of the placement	The work on the unit is split on a weekly basis between covering those patients already on the ward and initial assessment and management of new patients. During ward cover weeks there is a daily consultant ward round and the junior doctor is responsible for the care of between 14 and 19 patients
Typical working pattern in this placement	The working pattern will depend on the rota commitment. This may include out of hours. Clarification of this can be sought directly from the Trust.
