Placement	FY1 Obstetrics & Gynaecology
The department	The gynaecology provides care for all aspects of gynaecological conditions, which includes elective and emergency provision. As the Trust has a Cancer Centre, we provide gynae-oncology services for patients from Wolverhampton, Dudley and Kidderminster.
	The total number of patients admitted through the directorate is approximately 4,500 emergency, elective and day cases per annum. Outpatient attendance's amount to approximately 17,000 per year, of which 7,000 are new referrals.
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	 Educational opportunities F1: Once a week three hours of combined teaching for all trainees, Tuesday afternoon. Once a week, two hours of departmental teaching for all junior doctors. Obstetrics teaching for all junior doctors on Wednesday evenings. Informal teaching during rounds from several doctors. All Foundation trainees have dedicated simulation sessions. All episodes are consultant-led and will take place in the newly built Wolverhampton Sim Ward.
