	The respiratory job is demanding but ultimately rewarding. There will be an opportunity to gain experience in acute and chronic respiratory diseases but also during the acute medical take there will be an opportunity to manage the acute unwell patients within a variety of specialties.
	There is the opportunity to be involved in local or national respiratory/general medical audits and also to have teaching/presentation experience for Case Study presentations within the respiratory meetings.
	Due to the complex and long term consequences of patients with chronic respiratory disease you will gain experience in breaking bad news and improving your communication skills with the guidance of senior colleagues.
	Gain experience in the following additional procedures:
	 There will be an opportunity to experience some specific respiratory procedures including pleural aspiration and chest drain which would all be supervised by senior colleagues. As all pleural procedures are now USS guided you will gain experience in
	this.When on call the additional procedures may include lumbar puncture and ascetic tap.
