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The department	The department of psychiatry in Penn Hospital that provides training in psychiatry in Wolverhampton is linked to the local Mental Health Services. It is comprised of General Adult Psychiatry, Old Age Psychiatry, Learning Disability, Child and Adolescent Mental Health, Early Intervention services. Various clinical teams like Complex Care team in community, Home Treatment Teams, Liaison Mental Health Team, Well Being and Healthy Minds, teams are working supporting the patients. There are additional services like Eating disorder services and memory clinic. The in-patient facility is available in Penn Hospital.
