The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Educational Opportunities: Dedicated simulation sessions. These will take place in the newly developed Wolverhampton Sim Ward and are consultant-led. Weekly Dedicated FY2 teaching Thursday am, weekly respiratory meeting including Morbidity and Mortality meeting and journal club. Weekly Grand Round Gain Experience in: The respiratory wards provide care for patients with acute respiratory problems and general medical patients. Foundation trainees are part of team a supported by ST, CMT and Consultant colleagues on a daily basis, Ward C18 (female) and C19 (male) both provide NIV and C19 houses the pleural procedures room. Trainees also contribute to the acute medical take. The respiratory job is demanding but ultimately rewarding. There will be an opportunity to gain experience in acute and chronic respiratory diseases but also during the acute medical take there will be an opportunity to manage the acute unwell patients within a variety of specialties. There is the opportunity to be involved in local or national respiratory/general medical audits and also to have teaching/presentation experience for Case Study presentations within the respiratory meetings. Due to the complex and long term consequences of patients with chronic respiratory disease you will gain experience in breaking bad news and improving your communication skills with the guidance of senior colleagues. Gain experience in the following additional procedures: There will be an opportunity to experience some specific respiratory procedures including pleural aspiration and chest drain which would all be supervised by senior colleagues. As all pleural procedures are now USS guided you will gain
	experience in this. When on call the additional procedures may include lumbar puncture and ascetic tap.
