The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Undertaking consultations independently in surgery – managing acute and chronic medical problems. Following patients up and watching conditions evolve. Building on independent management plans and prescribing, yet receiving adequate support from GPs and Trainers in Practice. Undertaking suitable home visits, where appropriate, developing confidence with medical complexity and social issues. Practice education sessions (minimum 1 hour) Dedicated 2 hour weekly FY2 teaching at UHCW

Main duties of the placement	 Seeing patients in surgery consultations. Undertaking suitable home visits when confident. Speaking to patients on the telephone, where appropriate. Writing legible notes, to include suitable use of read codes and recognition of QOF requirements, where necessary. Undertaking good quality debriefs with Trainer, discussing difficult cases and asking questions where appropriate, to ensure patients receive good quality care. Following patients up appropriately. Writing own referral letters. Responding to tasks/requests by the Practice team. Reviewing pathology results and following up own referrals, as a learning tool for evolving conditions and outcomes. Actively participating in educational activity within the Practice, as the opportunity arises. Ensuring a good level of organisation and that all of the above are dealt with in a timely manner.
Typical working pattern in this placement	40 hours with Practice with two sets of two day time weekends on call in 4 month post on the Medical Assessment unit at UHCW (Consultant level supervision on site)
	Working hours within surgery time 8:30 – 6:30, surgery times set by the individual Practice.
