The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>Trainees will learn to take a sexual history and examination of the genitalia. They will learn the diagnosis and management of more common Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI's), testing for STI's, including HIV and the associated patient counselling.</p> <p>Education: Journal club, medical grand round and radiology meetings each occur at lunchtime once a week. There is protected teaching in the postgraduate centre on Friday afternoons.</p>

Supervisor(s) for the placement	Dr Loay David
Main duties of the placement	The trainee will attend clinics at George Eliot and Rugby St Cross before seeing patients on their own, and a senior doctor will always be available during clinic times for advice.
Typical working pattern in this placement	The trainee will do a twilight medical on-call shift once per week (11-7pm)
Employer information	<p>George Eliot Hospital has been an NHS Trust Hospital since 1994. The majority of the Hospital is based in modern purpose built accommodation. Currently there are 410 beds divided between the major specialities. There is a new Postgraduate Medical Centre with excellent library facilities, a clinical skills training unit and a computer skills training centre. There is a very strong commitment to junior staff training</p>
