The department	Haematology
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	The trainee will gain experience in interpretation of haematology investigations, blood and marrow films, chemotherapy prescription and administration, anticoagulant monitoring, blood transfusion and haematological procedures including bone marrow biopsy. There are multidisciplinary meetings on Tuesday and Wednesday, medical lunchtime meeting and an x-ray meeting both once a week.

Supervisor(s) for the placement	Dr Mekkali Narayanan
Main duties of the placement	The trainee will undertake ward rounds and attend clinics as part of the haematology team. There is a commitment to provide clinical cover for the laboratory and for the clinical service as required by the consultant haematologist. Middle grade cover will be provided by the staff grade.
Typical working pattern in this placement	There will be provision for twilight (11-7pm) cross cover duties in acute medicine one day a week.
Employer information	George Eliot Hospital has been an NHS Trust Hospital since 1994. The majority of the Hospital is based in modern purpose built accommodation. Currently there are 350 beds divided between the major specialities. The Postgraduate Medical Centre has excellent library facilities, a clinical skills training unit and a computer skills training centre. There is a very strong commitment to junior staff training
