The department	Respiratory/Acute Medicine
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Experience in the interpretation of lung function tests, blood gases, chest x-rays and non-invasive ventilation. The trainee will be exposed to pleural aspiration and biopsy and the insertion of chest drainage tubes.

Main duties of the placement	The trainee will attend ward rounds and clinics as part of the clinical team. There is also a bronchoscopy list and a multi-disciplinary meeting once a week.
Typical working pattern in this placement	The trainee will participate in the on-call rota for acute medicine.
Employer information	George Eliot Hospital has been an NHS Trust Hospital since 1994. The majority of the Hospital is based in modern purpose built accommodation. Currently there are 410 beds divided between the major specialities. There is a new Postgraduate Medical Centre with excellent library facilities, a clinical skills training unit and a computer skills training centre.
