Individual Placement Description – Wye Valley NHS Trust, Hereford County Hospital

Placement	FY1 Stroke Medicine
The department	The Stroke unit specialises in treating and caring for those patients with a suspected stroke admitted to The County Hospital. The unit has up to 26 beds providing both hyperacute and ongoing care for patients presenting with stroke and is situated on Wye ward on the first floor of the hospital. The team includes doctors, nurses, therapists and admin support who specialise in investigating, assessing and treating this group of patients. These clinicians are all skilled specialists who work primarily in stroke care and can therefore provide a high standard of care.
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	This post is an excellent opportunity to gain experience in both General Medicine and the initial and subsequent management of acute stroke. You will be based on the acute stroke unit. There are opportunities to gain experience and access learning in: ward rounds, medical outpatients, weekly F1 teaching, weekly medical grand round and handover.
	You will be working on the Stroke Unit, with usually around 22 patients, as well as supporting the department of medicine, taking responsibility for history and knowledge of the patient and presenting them on ward rounds. You will also need to identify and escalate where necessary the deteriorating patient and clerking in patients when on call. There is opportunity for regular bedside teaching relating to signs, conditions or investigations.
	This setting allows for the management and diagnosing of common conditions and will support learning in the following areas:

You will have the opportunity to work closely with a multi-disciplinary team to gain a
