Main duties of the	You will work as part of a team with 2 or more consultants, usually one 'SHO'
placement	and one registrar.
	You will be required to help out on other teams when their FY1 is unavailable or busy.
	You will participate in daily ward rounds of your consultants' patients.
	When on call you will be involved in- clerking surgical/ urology admissions in A+E, and looking after new surgical patients on the wards as well as acutely unwell surgical patients.
	Out of hours you are required to provide cross cover to other surgical specialities under senior supervision.
Typical working pattern in this placement	7 FY1 doctors take part in the rota which is a seven week cycle involving 5 days of 'daytime on call' (8am to 6pm) and 5 days of evening shifts (4pm to midnight). You will work 2 weekends per cycle (8am to 8.30pm) with a day off either before or after. The remainder of the time your normal working day is 8am to 4pm. The team structure means that you are well supported by senior staff
