The department	Department of Medicine, Alexandra Hospital, Redditch
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	During the F1 placement although trainees may be nominally allocated to a medical specialty e.g. Respiratory Medicine, Cardiology, Gastroenterology, Geriatric Medicine, Acute Medicine, Renal Medicine, Diabetes etc. the time table will structured in such a way that trainees are working in a team which covers more than one specialty. A significant part of your on call commitments will be working in the Medical assessment Unit assessing and managing patients who may be admitted under the care of a consultant in a particular specialty.
Where the placement is based	Alexandra Hospital, Redditch
Supervisor(s) for the placement	Consultant Endocrinologist
Main duties of the placement	Day-to-day ward care of in-patients admitted under the general (internal) medicine teams. This includes patient review, execution of management plans under the direction of the supervising consultant, organisation and review of relevant investigations, communication with the patients and their carer's, and writing discharge summaries.
Typical working pattern in this placement	1:14 rota
