The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	WRH ED is a medium sized DGH seeing approx. 65,000 attendances per year (25% paediatric) with an admission rate of 28%. On-site PPCI, stroke thrombolysis, and vascular surgery. Designated Trauma Unit. 8 bedded Clinical Decisions Unit for stays of up to 24 hours. Seeing all types of ED attenders (majors, minors, resus, paeds) under the direct 24hr supervision of middle grade EM doctor or consultants. Responsible for the initial assessment of ED attenders, together with formulation of management plans and implementation of urgent treatment in a friendly progressive department with a strong interest in post graduate education. Protected teaching time – EM (Thursday 11:00-13:30) FY2 (Wednesday 13-15:00). Bespoke ED induction programme.

Supervisor(s) for the placement	You will have a named clinical supervisor allocated to you, and will be informed who it is at induction
Main duties of the placement	You will assist the Consultants in the day-to-day clinical care of patients in the Emergency department/ CDU. Participate in the Clinical Audit programme and the quality control of the department. Actively participate in the weekly departmental teaching programme for the junior doctors.
