This may include community visits with non-medical staff. • Contribution to the out of hours on call rota for ½ the county, (non-residential) • Opportunities to hone mental state examination skills, history taking skills and explore mental health symptoms. • Opportunities to explore the interface of physical and mental health, together with long term well being in the community population. • Attendance at F2 teaching within the Acute Trust • Further learning of mental health law, mental capacity and human rights. • Opportunities to complete case-based discussions/mini cexs. • Opportunities to contribute to audit and present at countywide teaching. • Opportunities in terms of core procedures and directly observed procedures, appropriate to psychiatry. • Additional teaching bleep-free every Friday morning, normally 2 - 3 hours. Expected to present cases/journals to peers, Consultants etc. • Opportunities to teach medical and nursing students and allied health professionals • Opportunities to experience specialist mental health teams e.g. mother and baby, CAMHS, learning difficulties etc.
